



## Social Business Growth Fund

### Project Description

The Social Business Growth Fund (SBGF) supports social businesses in Wales financially to enable them to grow and create job opportunities. Financial assistance of up to £150,000 is available in West Wales and the Valleys and £125,000 in East Wales. Match funding of 40% of the total cost is required in West Wales and the Valleys and 50% is required in East Wales.

### Delivery Model

SBGF is delivered via an innovative model whereby 40% of the funding awarded is in the form of a traditional grant and the remaining 60% as repayable financial assistance. The amount repayable can be reduced through over achievement of job creation targets. Any remaining amount of repayable financial assistance is repaid over a period of up to 5 years after the end of the 18 month project period at 0% interest.

Applications can be made online via e-tenderWales. There is a two stage application process, the eligibility questionnaire (EQ), and for those who pass the EQ a Financial Assistance Application.

### Geographical Coverage

The project will benefit all local authority areas of Wales.

### Specific Targets

Job creation as a result of the funded activity. Targets are set based on the level of funding awarded and equates to £20,000 of funding per job created and sustained

### Essential Eligibility Criteria

Eligible organisation legal structures are:

- Company Limited by Guarantee
- Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO)
- Community Interest Companies (CIC) (inc those limited by shares)
- Industrial and Provident Society (IPS) in the form of a Community Benefit Society (BenCom)
- Financial Mutuals
- Limited by shares where all shares are held by one of the above (i.e. wholly owned social business subsidiary of a Charity)

# Cronfa Tyfu Busnesau Cymdeithasol

## Disgrifiad o'r Prosiect

Mae Cronfa Tyfu Busnesau Cymru yn cefnogi busnesau cymdeithasol yng Nghymru yn ariannol i'w galluogi i dyfu a chreu cyfleoedd am swyddi. Mae cymorth ariannol o hyd at £150,000 ar gael yn y Gorllewin a'r Cymoedd, a £125,000 yn Nwyain Cymru. Mae'n ofynnol cael 40% o arian cyfatebol o'r cyfanswm cost yn y Gorllewin a'r Cymoedd a 50% yn Nwyain Cymru.

## Model Cyflawni

Cyflawnir Cronfa Tyfu Busnesau Cymru drwy fodel arloesol lle dyfarnir 40% o'r cyllid ar ffurf grant traddodiadol a'r gweddill 60% fel cymorth ariannol ad-daladwy. Gellir lleihau'r swm ad-daladwy drwy ragori ar y cyraeddiadau neu ar y targedau creu swyddi. Telir yn ôl unrhyw swm o'r cymorth ariannol ad-daladwy sydd ar ôl dros gyfnod o hyd at 5 mlynedd, ar ôl diwedd y prosiect 18 mis, gyda llog 0%.

Gellir cyflwyno cais ar-lein drwy e-tenderWales. Mae'r broses gais yn cynnwys dau gam, yr holiadur cymhwysedd, a'r Cais am Gymorth Ariannol ar gyfer y rhai sy'n pasio'r holiadur cymhwysedd.

## Targedau Penodol

Creu swyddi o ganlyniad i weithgarwch wedi'i ariannu. Pennir targedau ar sail y lefel o
